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PREFACE LINGTERA VOL. 3 - NO. 2, OCTOBER 2016

LingTera Volume 3-Nomor 2 was issued in October 2016. For Indonesian people, October is the month of language. The appointment of October as the Month of Language referred to an important moment namely the commemoration of the Declaration of Youth on October 28th, 1928. At that time, the representatives of youth organizations from multiple classes, tribes and races all over the Archipelago gathered themselves around in Jakarta in order to hold the Congress of Youth. In the congress, these representatives declared three statements namely: (1) We, the children of Indonesia, declare that we have one land namely Indonesia; (2) We, the children of Indonesia, declare that we are one nation namely Indonesia; and (3) We, the children of Indonesia, declare that we will support our language of unity namely *bahasa Indonesia*. The third statement which states that the representatives would support the language of unity namely *bahasa Indonesia* implies that Indonesian people admit the existence of all languages in Indonesia, both the native languages and the foreign languages. However, from all native languages in the Archipelago, one language has been elected as the language of unity namely *bahasa Indonesia*.

In relation to the situation, the edition of *LingTera* October 2016 presents several articles in *bahasa Indonesia* and in foreign language. There are five English articles in this edition, namely: (1) The Influence of Reading Habit and Grammar Knowledge on the Students' Capability of Writing Narrative Texts; (2) Textual Function Variations of Foreign Embassies' Press Releases and their Implications for Translation Teaching; (3) Teachers' Perceptions on Using Community Language Teaching in the English Class; (4) Developing English Learning Materials Integrated with Character Values for the Elementary School Students; and (5) Developing English Materials for Nursing Students of Borneo. Then, there are also five articles in *bahasa Indonesia* within this edition, namely: (1) *Peningkatan Penggunaan Kosakata dalam Bahasa Indonesia dengan Metode Bermain Peran pada Siswa TK*; (2) *Meningkatkan Penggunaan Kosakata Siswa Kelas VIIB SMP melalui Teknik Permainan*; (3) *Kesepadan Makna Sosiolultural Terjemahan Lakon Lubdaka Buku the Invisible Mirror*; (4) *Pengaruh Minat Baca dan Gaya Belajar terhadap Kemampuan Menulis Mahasiswa*; and (5) *Penggunaan Alih Kode (Code Switching) dalam pembelajaran Bahasa Inggris di MA Mu'allimah Muhammadiyah Yogyakarta*.

These multi-language articles are intended to show the society that the caretakers of *LingTera* Journal are committed to develop all languages in Indonesia. Hopefully, the issuance of this edition might be a pacekeeper and a trigger for the authors and the readers in developing the Archipelagic Languages collectively.

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
